### Hyundai Hope on Wheels, Balasco Family Foundation Announce Generous Gifts



In June, the TGH Foundation announced another combined \$200,000 impact grant and regional grant from Hyundai Hope on Wheels to support the academic health system's pediatric oncology program in the fight against childhood cancer. The grants were awarded during a check presentation June 20 at TGH. The event was attended by system leadership, patients, physicians and members of the Tampa Bay Lightning, including team mascot ThunderBug.

Greg Balasco, owner of Lakeland Hyundai, announced a five-year, \$2 million pledge from Balasco Family Foundation and Lakeland Hyundai to support Muma Children's Hospital at TGH, where they will name the day hospital. He and wife Meredith Balasco presented a check for the first \$200,000 on Tuesday. "It's extremely humbling for Meredith and me to have a part in taking care of young children with cancer," Balasco said. "We appreciate the efforts of TGH, especially the physicians and care teams, in the fight against pediatric cancer. We're excited to continue to work closely with Muma Children's Hospital on its renovation."
